

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTEBS PATENT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That within one month after the last publication of this notice in the Royal Gazette, application will be made, by the parties hereinafter named, to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provision of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in Amendment thereof, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body politic and corporate under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1st. The proposed corporate name of the company is "THE WEST ISLES TELEPHONE COMPANY, Limited."

2nd. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To establish, maintain, operate, conduct and carry on a general telephone business in all its branches, including the building of offices, the setting, erecting and constructing of poles and posts; stringing or putting up of wires, making of connections, buying and selling of telephone instruments, wire and all other fittings, appliances and apparatus necessarily used and employed in carrying on a telephone business, and generally to do all and everything necessary to make complete, support, use, work and maintain a system of telephonic communication between Lord's Cove in the Parish of West Isles, in the County of Charlotte, and Richardsonville, Leonardville, Chocolate Cove, Fairhaven, all in the Parish and County aforesaid, and between such other points or portions of the said Parish of West Isles as the said Company may deem necessary or expedient or in its interests to so connect by telephone.

(b) To make connection with the cable or submarine wire of any company, corporation, individual or the Canadian Government, which may at any time hereafter be laid or constructed, and with whom the said company may hereafter be able to enter into satisfactory terms or arrangements for the purpose of establishing, securing and maintaining telephonic communication between some or all of the before-mentioned points in the said Parish of West Isles and the mainland, or any outside point or points not located or being in the said Parish of West Isles, such cable or submarine connection to be made at or from such point on the said Island or Parish of West Isles as the said Company shall deem most suitable, convenient and expeditious for its purposes, and as the said company may hereafter determine upon.

(c) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, own or hold such lands, grants, licenses, rights, privileges, buildings, plant and such other real and personal property, and such leases, licenses, options, franchises, rights and claims of, in, to and upon the same as may be required or deemed necessary for the purposes of or incidental to the business aforesaid, and to do all other things necessary for the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is sought.

(d) To erect and maintain the necessary posts, poles, wires and other works along the public streets and highways between the above named places or in the territory above specified, and for that purpose to have full power and authority given to the said Company, their successors or assigns, their agents, servants and workmen to enter upon the side or sides of all or any of the public roads, bridges, streets or highways within the said Parish of West Isles, and upon the same to set up, erect and construct such and so many posts, poles or other works as the said company in its discretion may deem necessary for making, completing, supporting, using, working and maintaining a system of communication by telephone between the said places or within the said territory; to stretch wires thereon and from time to time, as often as it may be deemed necessary, to break open any part whatsoever of the said roads streets or highways, not, however, to interfere with that part of the same appropriated for the use of carriages, wagons, or horses, and to keep the same open during the time necessary for the setting up, erecting, constructing, maintaining and repairing or replacing of such posts, poles or other works used in connection with the works of the said company.

3rd. The chief place of business of the company is to be at Lord's Cove in the Parish of West Isles, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4th. The amount of the capital stock of the said company is to be \$4000.00, divided into 800 shares of \$5.00 each.

5th. The name in full and the address and calling of each of the applicants are as follows:—
