To Licensees of Crown Timber Lands, and any others interested.

GENTLEMEN,—

As you are aware, during the last Session of the Legislature, it was announced by the Premier in his budget speech, that it was the intention of the Government to increase the Stumpage during the present season. In view of that fact and considering the very many important questions connected with the administration of the Crown Timber Lands of the Province, such as protection against fire, re-afforestation, etc., after consultation with my colleagues, I have considered it advisable, in the interest of the Department as well as of Licensees, that a conference of Lumbermen and those interested in the Crown Timber Lands should be held at Fredericton for the purpose of considering these questions with a view to more fully protect and promote the interests of all concerned. I have therefore decided to fix the fifth day of AUGUST next, at the Departmental Building, Fredericton, at 10 o'clock, a. m., for the purpose of such conference, and trust that you may find it convenient to attend, as I deem it most important that the meeting should be as large and as representative as possible, it being my intention to secure the attendance of an expert in forestry, who will doubtless be able to furnish valuable information on this important subject.
