

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and acts in amendment thereof, and in addition thereto, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned and set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE BARKERS, Limited."

2. The objects for which its incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern the mercantile and manufacturing business heretofore carried on in the City of Saint John and throughout the Provinces of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia by George Minchin Barker and Albert Anthony Barker under the firm name and style of G. M. & A. A. Barker, with all leases, stock-in-trade, property, assets and effects, choses in action, rights and credits of the said firm and the good will of the said business and to carry on the same or any part thereof and generally to carry on the business of manufacturers, merchants and traders, of and in all kinds of goods, wares, and merchandise and all things in connection therewith or incidental thereto.

(b) To purchase and acquire by exchange, or otherwise, stock-in-trade, franchises, patents, patent rights, trade marks, licenses, effects and assets of any persons, firms, or bodies corporate now or hereafter carrying on any manufacturing or mercantile business with the good will of any such business or to take security thereon and to carry on any such business or any part thereof or to sell and dispose of the same or any part thereof.

(c) To generate and manufacture electric light, gas, power and heat, and to sell, supply and dispose of the same to others and to enter into contracts for such purpose or in connection therewith.

(d) To purchase, take, lease, hire and acquire by exchange or otherwise and to have and hold real estate, personal property and securities of every nature whatsoever including bonds and stocks of any incorporated Company and to sell, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of and convey such property real and personal and securities or any part thereof with power also to sell the undertakings of the Company or any part thereof.

(e) To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being carried on in connection with the above or otherwise or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the goods, property or rights of the Company.

(f) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

(g) To amalgamate with any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company.

3. The head office or chief place of business of the Company is to be at the City of Saint John in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of capital stock is to be One hundred and ninety-five thousand dollars, whereof one hundred and eighty-four thousand six hundred dollars is to be "A" stock or ordinary stock, and ten thousand four hundred dollars is to be "B" stock or preference stock. The said "B" or preference stock shall confer the right to a fixed cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of ten per centum per annum and the right in a winding up to repayment of capital in priority to the "A" or ordinary stock (but shall not confer any further right to participate in profits or assets.)

5. The number of shares is to be 1950, and the amount of each share is to be \$100, of which shares 1846 shall be "A" or ordinary stock, and 104 shall be "B" or preference stock.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE PEOPLE'S LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY OF FREDERICTON, Limited."

The purposes and objects for which incorporation is sought are to carry on the business of an Electric Light Company in all its branches, for the purpose of supplying light to the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, and to other places in the vicinity of the said City of Fredericton and within the County of York, to light streets, places and buildings, public or private, and to construct, lay down,

establish, fix and to carry out all necessary cables, wires, lines, accumulators, lamps and works, appurtenances and appliances necessary or incidental thereto; to manufacture, sell, lease and use electricity for lighting, heating, mechanical or other and all such purposes; to construct, erect and maintain works, machinery and appliances, and to erect and place poles, wires, conductors and appliances for conveying electricity over, along, through, across and under the public streets, highways and bridges in the said City of Fredericton and the public roads, bridges and highways in and throughout the places adjacent thereto in the said County of York; and to enter upon by their agents, servants and workmen the side or sides of any and all the public streets, roads and bridges and highways of the said City of Fredericton and places adjacent thereto for the purpose of erecting and constructing the necessary works and appliances needful for carrying on the business and operations incidental to an electric light company the placing of said works and necessary appliances to be made under the supervision and to the satisfaction and subject to the consent of the City Council of the City of Fredericton and of the Municipal Council of the County of York.
