### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the fourth day of May, A. D. 1903, incorporating Frank E. Came, of Bay Side, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick, Manu-

facturer; James H. McAvity, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, Province aforesaid, Manufacturer; T. Harold Hoy, of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, Accountant; Stephen S. McAvity, of the City of Saint John aforesaid, Manufacturer; and Edmund S. Ritchie, of the same place, Barrister at-Law; for the following purposes, namely:—

To manufacture and sell railway rails, plant and supplies used in the construction, building and operation of railways, steamships, iron and steel railway and highway bridges, canals, cars, buildings and other structures, and for the manufacture and sale of all classes of iron, steel and wood products generally.

To carry on a general foundry, manufacturing and mercantile business.

To acquire and use water, steam, electric or other power for the purposes aforesaid.

To acquire and work patents in improvements in rails, plants and supplies, and generally to acquire and work patents for any mercantile or scientific device for any purpose whatsoever.

To acquire by purchase, license, or otherwise, and use, license or otherwise dispose of any invention, patent, right or letters patent for any of the purposes and undertakings herein mentioned or for any purpose generally.

To grant licenses to any person or company to use any patent, license, right or improvement held and owned by the Company.

To sell and dispose of the product or materials manufactured under any of the said licenses or patents; by the name of "RAILWAY SPECIALTY COMPANY OF CANADA, (Limited)"; with a total Capital Stock of One hundred thousand dollars, divided into one thousand shares of One hundred dollars each.

Passed 16th April, 1903.

An Act to legalize certain Marriages.

An Act to provide for the appointment of a Stipendiary or Police Magistrate, with civil jurisdiction, in the Parish of Upham, in the County of Kings.

An Act to provide for the appointment of a Stipendiary or Police Magistrate, with civil jurisdiction, in the Parish of Hampstead, in the County of Queen's.

An Act to postpone the County Valuation in the County of King's.

An Act authorizing the Councillors for the Parish of Saint David, in the County of Charlotte, to sell and convey lands and premises.
