PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Joseph A. McQueen, Esquire, High Sheriff of
the County of Westmorland, has made return to the
Honourable the Provincial Secretary, setting forth that an
election of the ratepayers of the Town of Shediac, in the said
County of Westmorland, was held at Shediac aforesaid on the
fifth day of December last, to determine whether the inhabi-
tants thereof should become incorporated under the provisions
of The Towns Incorporation Act of 1896.

That at such Election there were 114 votes cast; 77 of the
ballots being marked "For" and 37 of the ballots were marked
"Against."

That the boundaries of the said Town are as follows:—"Com-
mencing at a point on the East bank of the Scadouc River
two hundred yards South of the residence of James Webster;
thence running East until it strikes the Easterly side line
of land in possession of Charles Colwell, at a point eight
hundred yards South from the main road; thence Northerly
to the shore of the Bay of Shediac; thence Westerly follow-
ing the said shore to the mouth of the Scadouc River; and
thence Southerly following the several courses of the said
River to the place of beginning."

And it appearing by said Return that a majority of the
ratepayers of said Town have voted in favor of incorporation;
I do therefore proclaim that the said Town of Shediac, com-
prised within the boundaries hereinbefore described, be incor-
porated under and by virtue of the provisions of the Towns
Incorporation Act.
