

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the seventh day of January, A. D. 1903, incorporating Harrison A. McKeown, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Barrister-at-Law; William G. Dunlop, of the same place, Merchant; Samuel J. Thorne, of the same place, Clerk; Barzilai Van Wart, of the same place, Merchant; and Herbert G. Harrison, of the same place, Merchant; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase or otherwise acquire the steamer "Queen," registered at the Port of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, with all requisite equipment for the same, and to equip, own, control, sail, charter, let, hire, and manage the said steamer and such other steamer and steamers, if any, as may be hereafter purchased, built, owned, leased, or otherwise acquired or controlled by said Company for the conveyance of passengers, mails and freight upon the waters of the River Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, and upon the tributaries of the said river and other waters adjacent thereto and any other waters.

To build, purchase, charter, lease, or otherwise acquire steamers, vessels, and other conveyances using steam or other motive power, and to equip, own, hold, control, manage, sail, charter, let, and hire the same for the conveyance of passengers, mails, freight, and for other purposes.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire lands, tenements and hereditaments, and construct, build, purchase, lease, take on hire or otherwise acquire wharves, piers, docks, buildings or other property, or works, or equipment in the City of Saint John, in the said Province, and elsewhere, and such concessions, licenses and rights in respect of any of the same capable of being advantageously used in connection with the business of the Company.

To carry, convey, or transport passengers, mails and freight of all kinds for hire, and to do the work of common carriers by steamers, vessels and other conveyances, and in connection therewith to provide, furnish and sell food, refreshments and entertainment on land and water.

To mortgage, hypothecate, sell, or in any way dispose of all or any of the Company's property, rights, interests or possessions as may be deemed desirable by the Company.

To hold, purchase, or otherwise acquire, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of shares of the capital stock, or bonds, or debentures of any other corporation or corporations incorporated with object similar to those of the Company hereby incorporated, and while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

To do all or any of the things above set forth as objects, purposes, powers, or otherwise, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise.

To do all and everything incident, usual, necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incident to the powers named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, either as holder of, or as interested in, any property or otherwise; with all the powers now or hereafter conferred by the laws of the said Province upon corporations under the said Act, and the Acts in amendment thereof; by the name of "THE PRINCESS STEAMSHIP COMPANY (Limited)," with a total Capital Stock of Fifteen thousand dollars, divided into six hundred shares of Twenty five dollars each.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the parties hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal and in accordance with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act 1893," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE GEO. T. BAIRD Co., (Limited)."

2. The objects sought for in the incorporation of the said Company are:

a. To carry on a general lumbering, sawmill and woodworking manufacturing business in all its branches, including the logging, driving, sawing, manufacturing and shipping of lumber of every nature, kind and description, and the buying, selling and otherwise dealing in the same, manufactured and unmanufactured, and to operate sawmills for the sawing and manufacture of lumber.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the parties hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for the granting of Letters Patent under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893, and amending Acts.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "MERRITT BROS. COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

To purchase and acquire the mercantile and manufacturing business heretofore carried on in the City of Saint John and throughout the Dominion of Canada under the name, style and firm of "Merritt Bros. & Co., Agents," with the real estate, lands and premises, and all leases, stock-in-trade, personal property, choses in action, effects and assets of the said firm and the goodwill of the said business, and to continue the said business, and for the manufacture, importation and sale of goods, wares and merchandise, and generally to carry on the business of Manufacturers, Merchants and Traders of all things in connection therewith or incidental thereto.

Also to purchase and acquire stock-in-trade, real and personal property, plants, effects and assets of any person or persons or bodies corporate now or hereafter carrying on any manufacturing or mercantile business, with the goodwill of any such business, or to take security thereon, and continue such business so acquired or to sell and dispose of the same or the assets thereof.

Also for the purpose of generating and manufacturing Electric light, power and heat, and selling, supplying and disposing of the same to others, and entering into contracts for such purposes or in connection therewith.
