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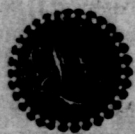

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New
Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts,
Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province
of New Brunswick, bearing date the 18th day of February, A. D.
1903, incorporating William Turnbull Chestnut, of the City of Fred-
ericton in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick,
Merchant; Albert Wesley Edgecombe, of the same place, Merchant;
John Smith Scott of the same place, Merchant; Gillmor Brown, of
the same place, Civil and Electrical Engineer; and John James Fraser
Winslow, of the same place, Barrister-at-Law; for the following pur-
poses, namely:

To carry on the business of an Electric Light Company in all its
branches, for the purpose of supplying light to the City of Fredericton,
in the County of York, and to other places in the vicinity of the said
City of Fredericton and within the County of York, to light streets,
places and buildings, public and private, and to construct, lay down,
establish, fix and to carry out all necessary cables, wires, lines, accu-
mulators, lamps and works, appurtenances and appliances necessary
or incidental thereto; to manufacture, sell, lease and use electricity
for lighting, heating, mechanical or other and all such purposes; to
construct, erect and maintain works, machinery and appliances, and
to erect and place poles, wires, conductors and appliances for con-
veying electricity over, along, through, across and under the public
streets, highways and bridges in the said City of Fredericton and the
public roads, bridges and highways in and throughout the places ad-
jacent thereto in the said County of York; and to enter upon by
their agents, servants and workmen the side or sides of any and all
the public streets, roads and bridges and highways of the said City
of Fredericton and places adjacent thereto for the purpose of erecting
and constructing the necessary works and appliances needful for
carrying on the business and operations incidental to an electric light
company; the placing of said works and necessary appliances to be
made under the supervision and to the satisfaction and subject to the

consent of the City Council of the City of Fredericton and of the
Municipal Council of the County of York. To carry on the business
of electricians, mechanical engineers and manufacturers and workers
and dealers in electricity, motive power, heat and light, and any
business in which the application of electricity or any power like or
otherwise, is or may be useful, convenient or ornamental, and, either
as principals or agents to trade, deal in and deal with, buy and sell
any article belonging to such business and all apparatus, appliances
and things used in connection therewith, or any inventions or patents.
To purchase, lease, hold, acquire and transfer all real estate and per-
sonal estate necessary for carrying on the operations of the Company,
and to do and have all other things as are incidental to the building,
equipping and managing, maintaining and carrying on a general
electric business; and for any and all the purposes hereinbefore
mentioned to obtain, accept and use all permits and all franchises,
municipal or otherwise; to borrow money upon the credit of the
Company; to issue bonds, debentures or other securities of the
Company for the lawful purposes of the Company, and to pledge or
sell the same for such sums and at such prices as may be deemed ex-
pedient or necessary and to hypothecate any and all such bonds, de-
bentures or other securities, and to mortgage and pledge the real and
personal estate and property to secure such bonds, debentures or
other securities; subject to certain conditions in the Letters Patent
more particularly defined, by the name of "THE PEOPLE'S LIGHT
AND POWER COMPANY OF FREDERICTON, (Limited);" with a total
Capital Stock of Eighty thousand dollars, divided into eight hundred
shares of One hundred dollars each.
