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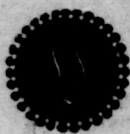

White Birch logs, for spool wood, per M. superficial feet.....	0 80

And for all other description of Lumber, such as Knees,  
Foot Hooks, Cordwood, etc., etc., Fifteen per cent. of the  
market value thereof at the mill, place of shipment or place  
of consumption in the Province.

The upset price for mileage on Timber Licenses will be  
Twenty Dollars per square mile, and the renewal mileage on  
Timber Licenses will be Eight Dollars per square mile.

Council, for a grant of a charter of Incorporation, by Letters  
Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick,  
according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock
