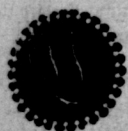

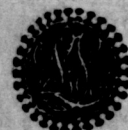
PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty-third day of July instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to THURSDAY the third day of SEPTEMBER next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty-second day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, and in the third year of His Majesty's Reign.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, Robert A. Stuart, Esquire, High Sheriff of the County of Charlotte, has made Return to the Honourable the Provincial Secretary, setting forth that an Election of the ratepayers of the Town of Saint Andrews, in the said County of Charlotte, was held at the Town of Saint Andrews aforesaid, on the fourteenth day of April last, to determine whether the inhabitants thereof should become incorporated under the provisions of The Towns Incorporation Act of 1896, and amendments thereto.

That at such election there were 140 votes cast; 111 of the ballots being marked "For," and 29 of the ballots marked "Against."

That the boundaries of the said Town are as follows: "Commencing on the Eastern shore of the Saint Croix River at the Western extremity of the South line of lot number 14 of the Western Commons Tract, so called, according to a Plan of the same by James Wilson, dated February, 1827, and filed at the office of the Secretary-Treasurer of the Municipality of Charlotte, thence Easterly along said South line of said lot number 14 to and across the Commons Road leading from Saint Andrews to Saint Stephen at its junction with the Maxwell road, so called, thence following the North side of the said Maxwell Road in an Easterly direction until it strikes the main highway leading to Saint John, thence in the same straight line across the said highway to its Eastern side, thence following the same in a Southerly direction to the Southern line of the lands of Nathan T. Blakeney, thence following said Southern line of said Blakeney's lands in an Easterly direction until it strikes the waters of the Passamaquoddy Bay. The Town of Saint Andrews shall comprise all that part of the Parish of Saint Andrews lying to the Southward of the above described line, including in the said Town Minister's Island and Navy Island."

And it appearing by said Return that a majority of the ratepayers of the said Town have voted in favor of incorporation.

In do therefore proclaim that the said Town of Saint Andrews, comprised within the bounds hereinbefore described, be incorporated under and by virtue of The Towns Incorporation Act of 1896, and Acts in amendment thereto.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the fifth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, and in the third year of His Majesty's Reign.
