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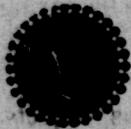

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made to
the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at its next Session,
for an Act to incorporate a Railway Company with power:

(a) To build, maintain and operate a line of railway from a
point at or near the junction of the railway of The New Brun-
swick Coal and Railway Company with the Central Railway at
Chipman to a point of junction with The Canada Eastern Rail-
way, thence to a point of junction with The Restigouche and
Western Railway, and thence to Edmundston, in the County of
Madawaska, or to a point of connection with the railway of The
Quebec and New Brunswick Railway Company.

(b) To build, maintain and operate a line of railway from the
point of junction of the Central Railway at Norton in the County of
Kings, to and through the Salt Springs Valley, by way of Barnes-
ville and Loch Lomond, to the City of Saint John, with power to
acquire land for terminals in or near to said City.

(c) To enter into contracts with The Canada Railway and Coal
Company, The Shediac and Coast Railway Company, The Saint
John Valley Railway Company, The Saint John Valley and Riviere
du Loup Railway Company and The Woodstock and Centreville
Railway Company for the construction of their several lines of
Railway, upon such terms as may be mutually agreed upon, and
if arrangements therefor are mutually made to operate all the
said lines of railway as part of and forming one system with

power to purchase, lease or amalgamate with the said Companies
or any of them.

(d) To amalgamate with or enter into traffic arrangements with
The Quebec and New Brunswick Railway Company, The New
Brunswick Coal and Railway Company, The Hampton and Saint
Martins Railway Company, The Moncton and Buctouche Rail-
way Company and any other Railway Company or Companies
within the Province.

(e) With power to extend the line of Railway which The Canada
Railway and Coal Company is authorized to build from Chipman
to Moncton to a point of connection with the line of The Shediac
and Coast Railway Company at or near Shediac, and also to extend
the Shediac and Coast Railway to the boundary line between the
Provinces of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

(f) With the usual power of issuing Debentures upon its line
or lines of Railway.
