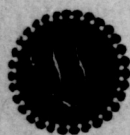

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the eighteenth day of June, A. D. 1903, incorporating J. Simpson Lord, of Lord's Cove, in the Parish of West Isles, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick, School Teacher; Frederic A. Richardson, of Richardsonville, in the said Parish and County, Merchant; Edwin A. McNeill, of Cumming's Cove, in the said Parish and County, Farmer; Wilford L. Randall, of Fairhaven, in the said Parish and County, Merchant; and Alexander Murray, of Leonardville, in said Parish and County, Physician and Surgeon; and others associated with them, for the following purposes, namely:—

To establish, maintain, operate, conduct and carry on a general telephone business in all its branches, including the building of offices, the setting, erecting and constructing of poles and posts; stringing or putting up of wires, making of connections, buying and selling of telephone instruments, wires and all other fittings, appliances and apparatus necessarily used and employed in carrying on a telephone business, and generally to do all and everything necessary to make, complete, support, use, work and maintain a system of telephonic communication between Lord's Cove in the Parish of West Isles, in the County of Charlotte, and Richardsonville, Leonardville, Chocolate Cove, Fairhaven, all in the Parish and County aforesaid, and between such other points and portions of the said Parish of West Isles as the said Company may hereafter deem necessary or expedient or in its interests to so connect by telephone.

To make connection with the cable or submarine wire of any company, corporation, individual or the Canadian Government, which may at any time hereafter be laid and constructed, and with whom the said proposed company may hereafter be able to enter into satisfactory terms or agreements for the purpose of establishing, securing and maintaining telephonic communication between some or all of the above-mentioned points in the said Parish of West Isles and the mainland, or any outside point or points not located or being in the said Parish of West Isles, such cable or submarine connection to be made at and from such points on the said Island or Parish of West Isles as the said proposed company shall deem most suitable, convenient and expeditious for its purposes, and as the said proposed company may hereafter determine upon.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, own and hold such lands, grants, licenses, rights, privileges, buildings, plant and such other real and personal property, and such leases, licenses, options, franchises, rights and claims of, in, to and upon the same as may be required or deemed necessary for the purposes of or incident to the business aforesaid, and to do all other things necessary for the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is sought.

To erect and maintain the necessary posts, poles, wires and other works along the public streets and highways between the above named places or in the territory above specified, and for that purpose to have full power and authority given to the said company, its successors or assigns, its or their agents, servants and workmen to enter upon the said side or sides of all or any of the public roads, bridges, streets or highways within the said Parish of West Isles, and upon the same to set up, erect and construct such and so many posts, poles or other works as the company in its discretion may deem necessary for making, completing, supporting, using, working and maintaining a system of communication by telephone between the said places or within the said territory; to stretch wires thereon and from time to time, as often as it may be necessary, to break open any part whatever of the said roads, streets or highways, not, however, to interfere with that part of the same appropriated for the use of carriages, wagons, or horses, and to keep the same open during the time necessary for the setting up, erecting, constructing, maintaining and repairing or replacing of such posts, poles or other works used in connection with the works of the said proposed company; subject to certain terms and conditions in the Letters Patent more particularly defined; by the name of "THE WEST ISLES TELEPHONE COMPANY, Limited"; with a total Capital Stock of Four thousand dollars, divided into eight hundred shares of Five dollars each.
