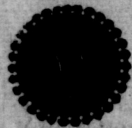

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the eighth day of November, A. D. 1904, incorporating John Russell, Junior, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; William H. Murray, of the same place, Manufacturer; John E. Moore, of the same place, Merchant; James V. Russell, of the same place, Merchant; Howard D. Troop, of the same place, Ship Broker; James Robinson, of Millerton, in the County of Northumberland and Province aforesaid,

Merchant; and James Kennedy, of the said City of Saint John, Merchant; for the following purposes, namely:—

To conduct and carry on a general printing and publishing business.

To acquire, print, publish, conduct, circulate, manage and control or otherwise deal with any newspaper or newspapers or other publications, and generally to carry on the business of newspaper proprietors and general publishers.

To conduct and carry on the business of printing, publishing and selling of books, pamphlets, papers and other publications, and general job printing, book-making and binding, electrotyping, lithographing, engraving, stereotyping, illustrated work in all its branches, and all other work connected with and incidental to a general printing and publishing business.

To purchase or otherwise acquire, take over, own, hold, conduct, carry on and continue the business of any other person, firm or corporation of like or similar lines to the business or businesses above mentioned, or any of them, or capable of being advantageously carried on therewith, with the stock in trade, real and personal property, plant, effects and assets thereof, and the goodwill of such business, and to pay therefor either wholly or partly in paid up shares in the Company or otherwise.

Generally to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real and personal property, and any rights and privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business.

To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertaking of the Company, or any part thereof, or all or any real or personal property or other assets of the Company, for such consideration and upon such terms and in such manner as the Company may deem desirable.

To acquire by original subscription, purchase, or otherwise, and to own, hold, manage, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of shares of the capital stock and bonds, debentures or other evidences of indebtedness created by any other company or companies, and while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership including the right to vote thereon.

To do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, either as holders of or as interested in any property, or otherwise, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do as well without as within the said Province; by the name of "THE ST. JOHN TIMES PRINTING AND PUBLISHING CO., (Limited)," with a total Capital Stock of One hundred thousand dollars, divided into one thousand shares of One hundred dollars each.
