

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the eighth day of November, A. D. 1904, incorporating Robert C. Elkin, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Ship Owner; Frances J. Elkin, of the same place, Married Woman; Frederick P. Elkin, of the same place, Clerk; Minnie G. Chalmers, of the same place, Married Woman; and Florence E. M. Elkin, of the same place, Spinster; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase or otherwise acquire, buy, sell, hire, construct, charter, trade in, manage, own, operate and control vessels, tug-boats, steamers and other craft, and any interests and shares therein and generally to carry on the business of ship broker, ships husband, ship agent, ship chandler and shipping merchant, and other like businesses.
