rights, franchises, privileges, patents and properties of any and every description.

To cultivate, raise, buy and sell all kinds of agricultural products or other articles.

To build, equip, buy, sell, manage or operate mills and factories, and also tramways, sail or steam vessels for the transportation of passengers or merchandise.

To undertake and complete contracts of any and every description for individuals, firms, corporations or governments.

To be factors or agents for conducting the business of individuals, firms or corporations.

To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber any or all the real and personal property of the Company for such consideration, and upon such terms, and in such manner, as the Company may deem desirable.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company advantageous in connection with the above lines of business or any of them.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE SAINT JOHN AUER LIGHT CO., Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:
