NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named, will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the "New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned and set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "ELGIN MILLING COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which such incorporation is sought are:—To own and operate a flour, feed and general grist mill or mills by roller or other process, and to purchase and sell grain and cereals of every kind, and to manufacture, buy and sell flour and other food articles manufactured from grain or cereals; to own and operate a mill or mills for the sawing and manufacturing of lumber and woodenware, and to manufacture and deal in articles of all kinds in the manufacture of which timber or wood is used; to establish and conduct a general store; to carry on a general milling, manufacturing, trading and mercantile business, and for these purposes to purchase, lease and acquire, and hold real and personal estate of all kinds, and to take and have and hold security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever; and to purchase and acquire the stock and trade, real and personal property, franchises, timber limits and concessions, patents, patent rights, licenses, effects and estates of any person or persons, or any incorporate company now or hereafter carrying on any milling, lumbering, manufacturing or mercantile business and to continue the same; to sell and dispose of or mortgage or give in security real and personal property owned by the Company or any part thereof; and to do all other matters and things necessary to the carrying on of the said milling, manufacturing and mercantile business or incidental thereto.

3. The office or chief place of business of the said Company is to be at Elgin, in the County of Albert and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the said Company is to be Ten thousand dollars, divided into two hundred shares of Fifty dollars each.
