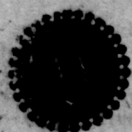

WHEREAS the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the tenth day of November instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to THURSDAY the twenty second day of DECEMBER next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four, and in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign.

### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, Robert A. Stuart, High Sheriff of the County of Charlotte, has made return to the Honourable the Provincial Secretary, setting forth that an election of the ratepayers of the Town of Saint George, in the said County of Charlotte, was held at the Town of Saint George aforesaid, on the Seventeenth day of October last, to determine whether the inhabitants thereof should become incorporated under the provisions of Chapter 166 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, intituled "The Towns Incorporation Act."

That at such election there were one hundred and sixty-six votes cast; one hundred and fourteen of the ballots being marked "For," and fifty-two of the ballots being marked "Against."

That the boundaries of the said Town are as follows: "Beginning at a point on the Southern shore of Lake Utopia, met by a line running due North from the lot owned by the late Dr. Robert Thompson, and formerly occupied by Thomas Burgess, thence South along said line until it reaches the Southeast corner of land known as the poor lot, thence Southwesterly along the rear line of the Mascarene Grant, thence along the rear line of said Grant to the Western line of Lot 55 of said Grant, then along said line to the Magaguadavic River, thence crossing the river and striking a Southerly prolongation of John Hart's West line, thence in a direct line to the hemlock tree at the Southwest angle of the Grant of Thomas Looby, thence North to the South line of the Hanson lot, thence East along said line to the Magaguadavic River, then crossing the River to the South line of the late Andrew Maxwell's lot, following the said line East to the West shore of Lake Utopia, following the Lake shore Southerly and Easterly to the place of beginning, to comprise all the territory now included in School District Number One in the Parish of Saint George and no more."

And it appearing by said return that a majority of the ratepayers of said Town have voted in favor of Incorporation:

I do therefore proclaim that the said Town of Saint George, comprised within the bounds hereinbefore described, be incorporated under and by virtue of the provision of the "Towns Incorporation Act."

Given under my hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the eighth day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four, and in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign.
