

## NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN. That application will be made to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal, in connection with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The name of the company is to be "THE IMPERIAL WINE AND SPIRIT COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a.) To carry on a general wholesale and retail wine and spirit business in all its branches, including the building and granting of offices, the buying and selling of all wines and spirits of every nature, kind and description, tobaccos, cigars and cigarettes, and generally to do all and everything necessary to make, complete, use, work and maintain a general wholesale and retail business in wines, liquors and tobaccos; and

(b.)
