

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the tenth day of February, A. D. 1904, incorporating John L. Peck, Merchant; Walter B. Steeves, Mechanic; Beecher Steeves, Mechanic; Herbert O. Steeves, Merchant; Harvey L. Steeves, Lumber Surveyor; all of the Parish of Hillsborough, in the County of Albert and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:—

To pay for such properties, rights, franchises or things as are above set out, either in shares of the Company, or partly in shares or otherwise, with full power to lease, sub-let, dispose of or otherwise deal with all or any part of the rights of the Company.
