

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the granting of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, in accordance with the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter named.

(a) The name of the Company is to be "THE ANDERSON FURNITURE COMPANY, Limited."

(b) The objects for which its incorporation is sought are:

1. To build, lease, purchase or otherwise own, hold and possess in fee simple, or otherwise, lands, grants, licenses, lumber lands, lumber rights, timber limits, options, mills, mill privileges, milling business, dwellings, stores, warehouses, machine shops, boiler shops, blacksmith shops, waterways, and rights, buildings, plant, machinery, marine slips, vessels, tugs, scows, barges, wharves, booms, dams, driving rights, franchises and privileges, and such other real and personal property as may from time to time be acquired or deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes of or incident to the business aforesaid, or any part of the same, with power from time to time to encumber the same or any part of the same, and from time to time to dispose of any property real or personal at pleasure, and to do any and all other things considered necessary for the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is sought as aforesaid.

(c) The office or chief place of business of the Company is to be at Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick.
