The Attorney General reports for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That there has recently been established at the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John, an Institution for the education of deaf or deaf mute persons, called the New Brunswick School for the Deaf; that the said School has been in operation for nearly a whole term previous to the 14th day of July last, and has now entered upon a second term; that said School has done excellent work during said term and is well equipped with apparatus and a competent staff of teachers to carry on the successful instruction of deaf mutes.

The Attorney General therefore recommends that the said the New Brunswick School for the Deaf be designated as a School to which deaf or deaf mutes persons may be admitted under the provisions of Chapter 52 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, and that this Order be published in the ROYAL GAZETTE, as provided in and by said Chapter 52.
