## IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT, 1893."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the parties hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the granting of Letters Patent under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE WOOD-STOCK LUMBER AND MANUFACTURING COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which the incorporation of the Company is sought are:

A. To purchase, hold and sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of Lumber lands and other lands in fee or otherwise, and also timber and timber limits by lease, license, or otherwise, and to manufacture, purchase and sell saw logs, timber and lumber, and to carry on the business of lumbering in all its branches, and other business incident thereto or connected therewith, and to manufacture furniture, doors, sashes, blinds and any other article of which wood shall form a component part.

B. To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and sell, build and operate Grist Mills, Flour Mills, Sawmills, Wood-working and Furniture Factories, and to carry on all business incident thereto or usually connected therewith, with power to purchase and sell and deal in grain and flour and bread stuffs generally.

C. To carry on a General Store and Mercantile business, and to buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of goods, wares and merchandise incident thereto.

D. To carry on a general business as Contractors and Builders.

E. To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy all the real and personal property, franchises, rights and privileges held and enjoyed by any other individual or Company carrying on business similar in whole or in part to that which this Company is authorized to carry on.

F.
