AT a meeting of the Local Board of Health, No. 17, held at Edmundston January 12, 1904, the following Resolutions were

Edmundston January 12, 1904, the following Resolutions were adopted:—

Whereas, during the last year it has come to the notice of this board of health, that frequently smallpox was brought into this county by people carrying on lumbering operations in this county, or travelling through the limits of this county to their points of operation, and that such has been a great factor in spreading and propagating the disease and causing great expenses to this county.

Be it resolved, therefore, by this local board, that any corporation or employer of men in this county, whether lumbering, driving or manufacturing lumber, or carrying on other works or operations, shall not employ men for any such works or operations, shall not employ men for any such works or operations, or have been vaccinated within the next preceding five years, or have had smallpox.

Further Resolved, That lumbering men, whether employer or employe, travelling through this county to their seats of operation, shall not travel through this county unless they have been vaccinated within the next preceding five years, or have had smallpox.

Purther Resolved, That these regulations shall come into force on the 1st of July of the present year 1904.

Further Resolved, That a penalty be imposed on every employer of men of \$10.00 for each man he hires or retains in his service, that have not complied with the above regulations as soon as they come into force.

Further Resolved, That a penalty of \$10.00 be also imposed on any employer of men for each man in his employ, travelling through this county to their seats of operation, who has not complied with the above regulations.

Further Resolved, That a penalty of \$5.00 be also imposed on each man who is employed in this county on any operation, or who travels through this county to their seats of operations, who has not complied with these regulations. And such fine in all above cases to be collected with costs. Also, in all above cases, vaccination shall be enforced in every case, and at the expenses of each individual.
