

## PUBLIC NOTICE

IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the applicants hereinafter named will, after the expiration of two weeks from the publication of this notice, apply by Petition to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick in Council, for the issue of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, in accordance with the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE VICTORIA ACETYLENE MANUFACTURING COMPANY OF CANADA, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which the incorporation of the said Company is sought are:

(a) To acquire patent rights and other rights, privileges and franchises, trade-marks, royalties, licenses, leases, assets and other rights, shares, bonds and securities of any person or persons or corporate company, and to sell and dispose of the same, or any part or portion thereof, with all the necessary powers incident thereto, and to manufacture and sell the said patented articles or commodities.

(b) To carry on in the said Province of New Brunswick the trade or business of buying, selling, by wholesale or retail, manufacturing and contracting for the manufacturing of Gas Machines, Generators, Purifiers, Lamps, appliances, commodities and all necessary apparatus and merchandise to produce Acetylene Gas for illuminating and other purposes, and of doing and carrying on mercantile transactions generally.

(c) To manufacture and contract for the manufacture of all or any patent rights, franchises, trade-marks and privileges, and to buy, sell, manufacture, trade or otherwise deal in any and every class of goods, commodities and merchandise necessary or incidental thereto.

(d) To buy, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy any lands and premises, or rights and privileges of and over lands, and to build, erect, hold, keep, improve, hypothecate, alienate, pledge and mortgage any real estate or personal property requisite for the carrying on the undertakings of said Company, including workshops, warehouses and rooms, stores, factories, machinery and plant, dwellings and other buildings necessary for the purposes of said Company.

(e) To acquire, continue and carry on any mercantile or manufacturing business now being carried on in the said Province of New Brunswick.

(f) To purchase, sell and dispose of all kinds of tin, zinc, iron, sheet iron, galvanized iron, brass and steel, manufactured or unmanufactured, for the purposes of the business of the said Company.

(g) To lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, alienate, sell and convey or otherwise deal in and with all and every part of the property, both real and personal, of the Company, upon any lands whatever, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, together with all such other powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the proposed Company or incident thereto.

(h) To act as agent for, buy, acquire, import, export, hold deal in and keep, lease, sell and dispose of and manufacture all such stock in trade, goods and chattels, wares and merchandise of every nature and description as by the Company or its directors be deemed necessary and advisable for the purposes of the said Company.

(i) To buy and otherwise acquire, possess, build, erect, hold, keep, improve, manage, lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, convey or otherwise encumber any or all real estate and personal property requisite for the carrying on the undertaking of the said Company.

3. That the office or chief place of business of the said Company is to be at Hampton, in the County of King's, in the Province of New Brunswick aforesaid.

4. That the Capital Stock of the said Company is to be Twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Roy Doull, one of the above named defendants, does not reside within the Province of New Brunswick, so that he cannot be served with a summons, and that his place of residence cannot be ascertained by the plaintiff, and that the above plaintiff has good prima facie grounds for filing a bill against the above defendants.
