NOTICE OF GRANTING SUPPLEMENTARY LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Supplementary Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-first day of April, A. D. 1904, whereby certain conditions, by Order of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, dated the twenty-first day of April, 1904, A. D., have been imposed upon "The People's Light and Power Company, Limited," a Company duly incorporated on the eighteenth day of February, A. D. 1903, which conditions are as follows:—

In the exercise of the powers conferred upon the said The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, the said Company shall not erect poles or string wires above ground upon the sides of the streets or highways within the City of Fredericton, at the same place upon the same side of a street or highway where The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, has and maintains its poles and wires: providing always, that the wires of the said The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, do not occupy both sides of a street or highway at any place; and further providing, that in open spaces where a distance of forty feet can be maintained between paralleling wires of the said The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, and the wires of the said The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, it shall not be necessary that The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, shall erect its poles and string its wires upon the opposite side of the street or highway to that occupied by the wires of The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited.

Where it is convenient or necessary for the wires of The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, to be carried above ground across the wires of The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, as now located and strung, such crossing shall be at a higher elevation than the present elevation of The New Brunswick Telephone Company's wires, save and except the crossing of the wires in making house or business connection by the said The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, which wires may be carried at a lower elevation than The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited's wires, providing the same be protected by The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, by guard wires or the crossing made by means of cable or cables; and further provided, that in no case shall the wires of The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, in making such crossing pass between the wires of The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, as now strung; and save and except that where the wires of The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, pass over tops of houses, buildings or erections other than poles at such elevation as to render it impracticable by reason of expense or otherwise for the wires of The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, to be carried across them at a higher elevation, then in the event of a disagreement between The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, and The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, as to the mode in which the wires of the said The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, shall cross those of the said The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, the mode of crossing shall be determined by two electricians, one of whom shall be chosen by The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, and the other by The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited; and in case of disagreement between the two so chosen, the said two electricians shall choose a third who shall determine the manner in which such crossing shall be made, and the expense, if any, caused by or incident to the changing or lowering of the telephone wires necessary to safely effect such crossing, shall be borne and paid by the said The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited. And provided also, that in all cases where by the conditions of these Letters Patent, the said The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, is permitted to cross the wires of The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, at a lower elevation than such wires, The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, shall make such crossing as far below the wires of the said The New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, as is reasonably practicable.

The said The People's Light and Power Company of Fredericton, Limited, shall in the construction, maintenance and operation of its works and system, so place and maintain its wires and use such means and appliances as may, as far as may be reasonably possible, prevent injury to the property of any person or corporation; and the said Company shall be liable in all damages to all persons or corporations suffering injury by reason of any failure on its part to comply with the foregoing provisions, and for any negligence in the construction, maintenance or operations of its works.
