To establish, maintain, operate, conduct and carry on a general telephone business in all its branches, including the building of offices, the setting up, erecting and constructing of poles, stringing or putting up telephone instruments, wires, and all other fittings, appliances and other apparatus ordinarily used and employed in carrying on a telephone business, and generally to do all and everything necessary to complete, support, use, work and maintain a system of telephonic communication in the Cities of Saint John and Fredericton, and extending from the City of Saint John via Rothesay, Perry Point, Kingston, Belleisle, White's Cove, to Fredericton, and also between such other points in the Counties of King's, the City and County of Saint John, Queen's, Sunbury and York as the said Company may hereafter deem necessary and expedient or in its interest to so connect by telephone, also to make connection with any other telephone Company or to lease the system of or amalgamate with any other Telephone Company: To purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, own and hold such lands, licenses, privileges, buildings, plant and other real and personal property as may be required for the above purposes. To erect and maintain the necessary posts, poles, wires and other works along the public streets and highways between the above named places or in the territory above specified and for that purpose to have full power and authority for the said Company, its successors and assigns, or their agents, servants and workmen to enter upon the side or sides of all or any of the public roads, bridges, streets or highways along which the said Company may deem it advisable to extend the said line or lines of telephone, and upon the same to set up, erect and construct such and so many poles or other works as the Company in its discretion may deem necessary for making, completing, supporting, using, working and maintaining a system of communication by telephone between the said places or within the said territory. To stretch wires thereon and from time to time as often as may be necessary to break open any part of the said roads, streets or highways (not however, to interfere with that part of the same appropriated for the use of carriages, sleighs, sleds, wagons or other vehicles or horses) and to keep the same open during the time necessary for the setting up, erecting, constructing, maintaining and repairing or replacing all such posts, poles or other works used in connection with the works of the said proposed Company. Subject to such terms and conditions more particularly defined in the Letters Patent; by the name of "THE CENTRAL TELEPHONE COMPANY, Limited;" with a total capital stock of Ten thousand dollars, divided into one thousand shares of Ten dollars each.

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the sixth day of January, A. D. 1904, incorporating Carson Flood, of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Edward Hugh Sufferin Flood, of the same place, Merchant; George Herbert Flood, of the same place, Merchant; Thomas John Flood, of the same place, Merchant; and William Austin McLaghlin, of the same place, Clerk; for the following purposes, namely:—

To acquire and take over as a going concern the business now carried on by C. Flood & Sons, and all or any of the assets and liabilities of that firm in connection therewith, and to carry on the same or any part thereof.

To carry on the business of wholesale and retail dealers in stationery, fancy goods, jewelry, plated goods and articles required for ornament, recreation or amusement, gold and silversmiths, booksellers and publishers, dealers in musical instruments, and all other articles and commodities of personal and household use and consumption, and generally to buy, sell and deal in all kinds of merchandise, goods and materials.

To sell, manufacture, repair, alter and exchange, let on hire, export and deal in all kinds of articles and things which may be required for the purposes of any of the said businesses or commonly supplied or dealt in by persons engaged in such businesses, or which may seem capable of being properly dealt with in connection with any of the said businesses.

To transact all kinds of agency business; by the name of "C. FLOOD & Sons, Limited;" with a total Capital Stock of One hundred thousand dollars, divided into one thousand shares of One hundred dollars each; whereof \$30,000 is to be "A" Stock or ordinary stock, and \$20,000 is to be "B" Stock or preference stock. The said "B" or preference stock shall confer the right to a fixed cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of seven per cent. per annum and the right in a winding-up to repayment of capital in priority to the "A" or ordinary stock, (but shall not confer any further right to participate in profits or assets), and the right to elect directors of the Company subject to the following conditions: Should the total number of the Directors of the Company be an uneven number, the holders of the "B" or preference stock shall have the right to elect annually such portion thereof as will make the number of Directors so elected by them one less than the balance of the total number of Directors, and if the total number of Directors be an even number then the holders of the "B" or preference stock shall have the right to elect one less than one half of the total number of said Directors, but the holders of the "B" or preference stock shall not be entitled to vote for the election of the balance of the Directors.
