DEPARTMENT OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE OF CANADA.
OTTAWA, 15th February, 1904.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL has received a further telegram from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies directing that the following additional rules be added to those already published touching the coaling of belligerent vessels of war in British ports:—

1. During continuation of hostilities no coal to be supplied to war ships of either of the belligerent powers except on a written authorization of the competent port authorities, specifying the amount of coal which may be supplied;

2. Before issuing any authorization for the supply of coal to any belligerent war ship, the port authority shall obtain a written declaration duly signed by the officer commanding such war ship, of the destination to which it is proceeding and the amount of coal already on board.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a Grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purpose hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is J. SUTTON CLARK COMPANY, Limited.

2. The objects for which the Company is sought are:—

(A) To purchase or otherwise acquire, take over and hold the canning, weir and other businesses now carried on by J. Sutton Clark at Letang, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick,

and at New Edinburgh, Digby County, Province of Nova Scotia, and all and any of the real estate, weirs, fishing privileges interest in weirs, fishery licenses, steam factory, factories, factory buildings, mill privileges, buildings, machine, machinery, tools, plant, wharves, piers, water rights, franchises and other real estate and personal property, rights, privileges, plant and assets of said J. Sutton Clark, or any part or parts thereof, or any interest or interests therein, and to assume all or any contracts, undertakings and liabilities of said J. Sutton Clark in respect of said businesses, or any of them, and to carry on, operate and continue said canning, weirs and other businesses, with power to vary, extend and enlarge the same.

(B) To carry on a general canning business, including power to manufacture, import and ship, export, transport, buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of fish, bait and other food products, fertilizer, etc., and to do all other things usually done in a general canning and fish business.

(C) To manufacture, produce, buy, sell, transport, trade and deal in fish, oil, tin, lead, metals and like material of every nature and kind, and the products of fish, oil, tin, lead, metals and like materials, and also to manufacture, work, buy, sell, transport, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of metals and their products, and all kinds and classes of fish and fish products, and all products and by-products derived from the operation of the plants of the said Company.

(D) To manufacture, generate, use, buy, sell, accumulate, store, transmit, furnish and distribute electric current for light, heat and power, and to manufacture, buy, sell, operate, lease and let electrical plant, fixtures, fittings, supplies and appurtenances used in connection therewith.

(E) To carry on a general store and supply business, and to buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of goods, wares and merchandise incident thereto.

(F) To construct a cold storage plant when deemed necessary or desirable or convenient for the business of the Company.

(G) To construct and maintain a telephone or telegraph line and water mains where necessary, convenient or desirable for the business of the Company, and for that purpose, subject to the municipal regulations as to the construction and maintenance thereof, to have the right to place, construct, erect and maintain upon and along the highways all necessary poles and line of wire and pipe lines.

(H) To purchase, lease, let, hire, charter, construct, build, erect, manufacture or otherwise acquire, and own, hold, operate, manage and control for use in connection with any business or undertaking of the Company, or otherwise, fishing supplies, camp, camping outfits, steam canning factory, steam sawmill or mills, cooperage shop, forge, foundry and machine shops, residences, workingmen's houses, boarding houses, dams, wharves, boats, barges, scows, vessels, tugs, steamers, machines, machinery, implements, and other buildings, erections, craft and plant, goods, chattels and effects as may be found necessary, convenient and desirable for use in or in connection with any business or undertaking of the Company.

(I) To acquire by purchase, lease, charter, or otherwise, and to own, hold, operate, manage and control canning factories, weirs and real estate, grants, fishing licenses, fishing privileges, mills, mill privileges, water privileges, water rights, franchises, patents of inventions, rights and interests in patents of invention, stock and shares in other Joint Stock Companies, whether incorporated with like or similar objects, or otherwise, plant, machinery, tugs, vessels, scows and such other franchise and rights and real and personal property, or interests therein, or in any of the same, as may from time to time be required or be deemed necessary, convenient or desirable for all or any of the purposes, businesses or objects aforesaid, or any of them, or any part of the same, or as may be incident thereto, and generally to purchase, take or lease or in exchange, charter, hire or otherwise acquire any real and personal property, and any and all rights and privileges which the Company may think necessary, convenient or desirable for any of the purposes of its business, with power to said Company from time to time and at all time to lease, mortgage, hypothecate, pledge, exchange, sell, let, encumber or otherwise part with or dispose of any of the real or personal property, rights or privileges of said Company, or any interest or interests therein.

(J) To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the aforesaid business or any of them, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the Company's property or rights.

(K) To do any and all things above set forth as objects, purposes, or otherwise, and any and all things necessary, suitable, convenient, desirable or proper for the accomplishment of the purposes or the attainment of one or more of the objects hereinbefore enumerated or incidental to the powers hereinbefore named, or which shall or may at any time appear conducive or expedient to such accomplishment or attainment, or for the benefit or protection of the Company, either as holders of or interested in any property or otherwise, and as well without as within the said Provinces, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do.

3. The office or principal place of business of the Company is to be St. George, in the County of Charlotte, in said Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of Capital Stock of said Company is to be One hundred and fifty thousand dollars, divided into fifteen hundred shares of One hundred dollars each.
