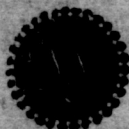

GOVERNMENT NOTICE—PROVINCE OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

RE EXTRA PROVINCIAL CORPORATIONS.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That by Act of the Legislature
of the Province of New Brunswick, passed on the 9th day of May,
A. D. 1903, intituled "An Act respecting the Licensing of Extra
Provincial Corporations," provision is made that Companies in-
corporated without the Province, in respect to which no license
fee is now payable under some other Provincial Statute, shall
pay a license fee for doing business within the Province and
shall also pay an annual license fee thereafter. The fee payable,
where the capital stock does not exceed \$100,000, is \$50; where it
exceeds \$100,000, \$100.

This Act will come into force on the first day of July, A. D. 1903,
but will not apply to any Corporation doing business within the
Province at the time of its passage, prior to the first of November,
1903.

DEPARTMENT OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE OF CANADA.
OTTAWA, 15th February, 1904.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL has received a further
telegram from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for
the Colonies directing that the following additional rules be

added to those already published touching the coaling of belli-
gerent vessels of war in British ports:—

1. During continuation of hostilities no coal to be supplied to
war ships of either of the belligerent powers except on a written
authorization of the competent port authorities, specifying the
amount of coal which may be supplied;

2. Before issuing any authorization for the supply of coal to any
belligerent war ship, the port authority shall obtain a written
declaration duly signed by the officer commanding such war
ship, of the destination to which it is proceeding and the amount
of coal already on board.
