PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "W. F. HATHEWAY COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are as follows:—

(a) To acquire, purchase and take over, carry on and continue the wholesale grocery business and also the business of importing and merchandizing Tea, at present carried on by W. Frank Hatheway and Company at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, together with the stock, stock in trade, goods, chattels merchandize, property, assets and effects belonging thereto, and also the good-will of the said business, and all rights and credits, choses in action, securities for the payment of money, bonds, mortgages, real estate, judgments, liens, book debts, debits and credits, accounts and liabilities thereto belonging or appertaining or connected therewith, and upon such terms as may be agreed upon for the acquiring of the said business and property.

(b) To conduct and carry on a general wholesale grocery business and a Tea importing business, and the business of buying and selling and dealing in all kinds of merchandize that is usual or customary to be dealt with in connection with such a business.

(c) To conduct a general mercantile business in all or any branches of merchandize, buying and selling any and all classes and descriptions of goods and merchandize.

(d) To act as agents in the buying and selling of goods, wares and merchandize, or other properties or securities, and to buy and sell on commission.

(e) To purchase and acquire the stock, stock in trade, real and personal property, franchise, rights, licenses, assets and rights, shares, bonds and securities of any person or persons, or of any incorporated company or companies, and to sell and dispose of the same, with all necessary powers incident thereto.

(f) For any or all of the above purposes to purchase, acquire, hold, lease, sell, convey, dispose of, mortgage, pledge or otherwise encumber real estate and any interest in real estate or personal property, or any interest in personal property, and generally to do all matters and things necessary to do for the said purposes or objects.

3. The chief or principal place of business of the said Company is to be at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The proposed Capital Stock of the said Company is Seventy-five thousand dollars, to be divided into seven hundred and fifty shares of One hundred dollars each.
