#### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the eleventh day of April, A. D. 1904, incorporating Walter W. White, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Physician; John E. Moore, of the same place, Merchant; William McCavour, of the same place, Merchant; Samuel P. McCavour, of the same place, Merchant; and Alexander P. Barnhill, of the same place, Barrister-at-Law; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over the whole-sale grocery and provision business now carried on in the City of Saint John by Walter W. White and John E. Moore, under the firm name and style of V. S. White & Co., with the stock in trade and good-will of the business, and to carry on and continue said business.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over the whole-sale grocery, provision and fish business now carried on by William McCavour and Samuel P. McCavour at the City of Saint John aforesaid, under the firm name of McCavour & Co., with the stock in trade and the good-will thereof, and to carry on and continue said business.

Also to purchase or otherwise acquire, take over, own, hold, carry on and continue the business of any other person, firm or corporation of like or similar lines to the businesses above mentioned or capable of being advantageously carried on therewith, with the stock in trade, real and personal property, plants, effects and assets thereof, and the good-will of such business, and to pay therefor, as well as for the above mentioned businesses, or either of them, either wholly or partly in paid up shares in the Company or otherwise.

To conduct and carry on the general wholesale grocery, provision, tea and fish businesses in all their branches, and to do all other things incident to each such general wholesale business.

To conduct and carry on a general mercantile business.

To cure, salt, pack and otherwise treat and prepare for market fish and other food stuffs.

As principal or for any other person or persons, firms or corporations, as commission merchant, broker, manager, agent, factor, warehouseman or in other capacity, for hire, to buy, sell, store, warehouse, exchange, import, export, prepare for market or otherwise handle, trade or deal in, or with groceries, teas, provisions, fish and other food stuffs and other goods, wares and merchandise.

To acquire by original subscription, purchase or otherwise, and to hold, own, sell, transfer, pledge, mortgage or otherwise dispose of or encumber shares, stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations or evidences of interest in or of indebtedness of any other incorporated company or body corporate or corporation authorized to issue shares, stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations with power, while the holder thereof, to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

Generally to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any real and personal property and any rights and privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business.

To apply for, obtain, register, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, and to hold, own, use, operate, introduce and sell, assign or otherwise dispose of any and all trade marks, formulae, trade processes, trade names and descriptive marks, and all inventions, improvements and processes used in connection with or secured under Letters Patent or otherwise, of the Dominion of Canada or of any other country, and to use, exercise, develop, grant licenses in respect of or otherwise turn to account, any and all such trade marks, patents, licenses, concessions, processes and the like.

To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof, or any real or personal property of the Company for such consideration and upon such terms and in such manner as the Company may deem desirable.

To do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, either as holders of or as interested in any property or otherwise, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do, and as well without as within the said Province.

And the objects and powers specified in the above clauses shall, except where otherwise expressed in any such clause, be nowise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other such clause, but that the objects and powers specified in each of the clauses shall be regarded as independent objects and powers unless otherwise therein stated; by the name of "ST. JOHN MERCANTILE COMPANY (Limited)," with a total Capital Stock of Eighty thousand dollars, divided into eight hundred shares of One hundred dollars each.

No shareholder shall, except with the consent of the Board of

Directors, sell or offer for sale, any shares of stock in this Company, unless and until he shall first have made an offer in writing to sell said shares to this Company for itself or any then shareholder at the rate (being not less than par) at the time prescribed by by-law as the value per share, and unless and until said offer shall have remained open for the acceptance of this Company for the period of five days and the Company shall have refused or neglected to accept the same.

The Company may, in addition to the other rights and powers given, use and apply its surplus earnings or accumulated profits to the purchase or acquisition of shares of its own capital stock from time to time, to such extent and in such manner and upon such terms as its Board of Directors shall determine, with power to re-issue the same or any part thereof.

To purchase, acquire, maintain, operate and carry on a job printing business, book bindery, stereotyping, electrotyping and engraving plant or plants at the City of Saint John or elsewhere within the Province of New Brunswick.

To purchase, acquire, maintain, operate and carry on a general publishing business at the City of Saint John or elsewhere within the Province of New Brunswick.

To purchase, acquire, operate and maintain a plant or plants for the generation of electric lighting and power necessary for the conduct of the business above specified, with power to dispose of any surplus electric power and lighting so manufactured.

To buy, sell, exchange, mortgage, hypothecate, pledge, use, manufacture, trade and deal in any and all machinery, plant, apparatus, supplies and equipment used or capable of being used for or in connection with or in furtherance of any and all purposes aforesaid.

To purchase, acquire, take, hold and enjoy either in fee or for any term, or under lease any lands or tenements, or interest or estate therein which the Company may deem necessary to so deal with for the purposes of their business, and to assign, exchange, release, convey, mortgage, or demise by lease any lands or tenements so acquired or held as and when the Company may deem it expedient so to do.

To make and enter into any contract or contracts with any person, persons, firm, firms, body corporate, or bodies corporate to carry on or conduct, or aid or assist in carrying on or conducting any of the business or matters aforesaid, or incident thereto or connected therewith, either in partnership with such person, persons, firm, firms, body corporate or bodies corporate or otherwise as the Company may deem expedient, and to employ any and all such persons, firms or bodies corporate as the agent or agents, employee or employees of the Company.

To make, draw, accept and endorse promissory notes and bills of exchange, and to make any and all contracts in or about, touching or affecting the business or undertakings of the Company, and generally to have and enjoy all and every the powers and privileges incidental by law to a trading corporation and without any restriction or limitation by reason of any particularity herein.
