

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the applicants hereinafter named will, after the expiration of two weeks from the publication of this notice, apply by Petition to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick in Council, for the issue of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, in accordance with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1st. The proposed name of the Company is "THE SAINT JOHN LADDER COMPANY, Limited."

2nd. The objects and purposes for which the incorporation of the said Company is sought are:
