

(f) To purchase, contract, maintain, control and conduct all manner of buildings, stores, supply-houses, depots, works, warehouses, cars and other conveyances by land, ships and other conveyances by water, and the same, at pleasure, to equip and maintain with any form of cold storage plant, refrigerating plant, insulating plant or machinery using steam, water, gas, electricity, or any other form of power, machinery, plant or works which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to or expedient or useful for any of the purposes of the Company, and may carry on the general business of cold storage or refrigeration in all its branches.

(g) To act as common carriers, to purchase or otherwise acquire and deal in meats, fish, poultry, live stock, grain, fruits, berries, cheese, butter, eggs, and all other kinds or varieties of animal products, vegetable products, farm product or bread stuffs, and to make advances for the purposes of the Company on all or any of such property.

(h) To carry on the business of buying, selling, trading, bartering and dealing in all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise, including farm products, both wholesale and retail, and generally to conduct and carry on a general mercantile or supply business, in all or any branches of merchandise, buying and selling any and all kinds, classes and descriptions of goods, wares and merchandise, and generally to carry on business as general merchants and traders.

(i) To act as agents in buying and selling goods, wares and merchandise or other properties and securities, and to buy and sell on commission.

(j) To purchase lease or otherwise acquire, lands, leases, licenses, interests, options, easements and privileges within the Province of New Brunswick, or elsewhere within the Dominion of Canada, and also to obtain rights, authorities, concessions or grants, relating thereto or otherwise.

(k) For any of the above purposes to acquire, hold, enjoy, sell, lease, mortgage or dispose of lands, stores, factories, warehouses, mills and plants considered necessary, desirable and expedient by the Company, and generally to do all matters and things necessary to said several purposes and objects.
