NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That within one month after the last publication of this notice in the Royal Gazette, application will be made to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a charter of incorporation by Letters Patent, under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body politic and corporate, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE VICTORIA HOTEL COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(1) To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over the hotel business now being conducted by D. W. McCormick at the City of Saint John, under the name of the Victoria Hotel, and all lines of business conducted by the said D. W. McCormick in connection therewith, and all the hotel and other furniture, furnishing, fittings, fixtures and other personal property and assets owned by the said D. W. McCormick in connection with said hotel business and the other lines of business conducted by the said D. W. McCormick, together with all the book debts and other assets thereof, and to assume all the obligations thereof and pay therefor in paid up stock of the company, and to continue said business in all its branches.

(2) To conduct and carry on a general hotel business in all its branches, and other businesses usually carried on in connection therewith at the City of Saint John and elsewhere.

(3) To purchase, establish or otherwise acquire any other business which may seem to the company capable of being carried on in connection with any business of the company, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the company's businesses or properties.

(4) To acquire by original subscription, purchase or otherwise, and to hold, own, sell, transfer, pledge, mortgage or otherwise

dispose of or encumber, shares of stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations or evidences of interest in or of indebtedness of any other incorporated company or body corporate or corporation authorized to issue shares, stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations with power, while the holder thereof, to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

(5) Generally to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any real or personal property and any rights and privileges which the company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business.

(6) To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber, the undertaking of the company or any part thereof, or any of the real or personal property of the company, for such consideration and in such manner and upon such terms as to the company may seem desirable.

(7) To do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, either as holders of or as interested in any property or otherwise to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do and as well without as within the said Province.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be in the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

UNDER "THE LIQUOR LICENSE ACT, 1896."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the Liquor License Commissioners for the License District of Restigouche County, under "The Liquor License Act, 1896," will meet at the Court House in the Town of Dalhousie, on THURSDAY the 21st day of APRIL instant, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to consider applications for license to sell liquor under the provisions of the said Act in the said license district, for the year commencing the first day of May next, and any other matter relating thereto that may come before them.

The total number of licenses in this district at present is six—all retail; three of which are in the Parish of Dalhousie, the licensees being Thomas Murphy, Henry Wipper and Leon Samson; and three in the Parish of Durham, the licensees being Michael P. Doyle, Felix Ultican and John Barbour.

Three of the said licensees, namely, Thomas Murphy, Henry Wipper and Felix Ultican, have filed their petitions, as the law directs, for a renewal of the licenses for their respective premises for the ensuing license year.

There are two new applicants whose petitions show that they desire to sell liquor by retail at the undermentioned places, namely, Eugenie Samson, who petitions for a renewal, in her own name, of the same kind of license for the same house and premises in the Town of Dalhousie as her late husband held when he died a few days ago; and Felix Frenette, who petitions for a renewal, in his own name, of the same kind of license as John Barbour held for the house and premises at Jacquet River, which license upon his removal from the said house and premises he transferred to the said Felix Frenette, who now occupies the premises.
