



### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS D. Beverly Hatfield, Esquire, High Sheriff of the  
County of King's, has made return to the Honourable the  
Provincial Secretary, setting forth that an election of the rate-  
payers of the Town of Sussex, in the said County of King's, was  
held at Sussex aforesaid, on the eighteenth day of May last, to  
determine whether the inhabitants thereof should become incor-  
porated under the provisions of "An Act to incorporate the Town  
of Sussex."

That at such election there were 232 votes cast; 140 of the  
ballots being marked "For," and 90 of the ballots being marked  
"Against," and 2 ballots having been spoiled.

And it appearing by said Return that a majority of the rate-  
payers of said Town have voted in favor of incorporation;

I do therefore proclaim that the said Town of Sussex, comprised  
within the boundaries particularly set forth and described in the  
seventeenth section of the said Act, be incorporated under and by  
virtue of the provisions thereof, on, from, and after MONDAY  
the twenty-seventh day of JUNE instant.
