

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the seventh day of March, A. D. 1905, incorporating Timothy Lynch, of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, Lumberman; Margaret Lynch, of the same place, Married Woman; Peter B. Millie, of Glassville, in the County of Carleton, in said Province, Accountant; Timothy Leo Lynch, of the City of Fredericton aforesaid, Student; Thomas Bernard Lynch, of the said City of Fredericton, Student; and James D. McMillan, of Boiestown, in the County of Northumberland, in said Province, Surveyor of Lumber; for the following purposes, namely:—

To carry on a general lumber business in all its branches, including the logging, driving, sawing, manufacturing and shipping of lumber of every kind and description, and the buying, selling and dealing in lumber of every kind, both manufactured and unmanufactured, both wholesale and retail; to acquire, erect and maintain saw mills and operate same for the sawing and manufacturing of lumber of all kinds, and converting and manufacturing wood into pulp

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, and to own, hold, and possess in fee simple or in any less estate, lands, grants, timber lands, timber rights, options, mills, mill privileges, milling businesses, waterways and rights, buildings, plant, machinery, vessels, tugs, scows, booms, dams, driving rights and franchises, and to acquire timber licenses issued either by the Crown or by private individuals or corporations, and to acquire and hold such other real and personal property as may from time to time be required or deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes of or incident to the business aforesaid, or part of it, with power from time to time to encumber, mortgage or hypothecate the same or any part of it, and from time to time to sell and dispose of any property, real or personal, or mixed, as the requirements or exigencies of the business may require, or at the pleasure of the Company.

And for the purposes of the Company to carry on a general wholesale and retail mercantile business in goods, wares and merchandise of every kind and description.

To carry on any other business whether manufacturing or otherwise which may seem to the company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with any business of the company, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the company's property or rights.

To acquire and undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business which this company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this company.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in-Council for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," constituting the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes following:—

1. The proposed name of the Company is "YORK AND SUNBURY MILLING COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—

To carry on and prosecute a general lumbering, milling and wood manufacturing business in all its branches, including the logging, driving, sawing, milling, manufacturing, shipping and selling lumber and lumber products and woods of all kinds and descriptions, and the manufacture and sale of goods and articles wholly or partially made of wood, and also a general mercantile business, both wholesale and retail, and to do all things as are incident to such objects, with power—

To build, erect, equip, establish, maintain and operate mills, mill buildings, woodworking factories, houses, stores, warehouses, blacksmith shops and machine shops.

To construct, purchase, lease or acquire and maintain any plants, buildings, works, factories, mills and machinery that may be necessary or useful to the undertakings of the Company.

To purchase, lease or hold lands in fee simple, or otherwise, including licenses of Crown lands, with power to sell, mortgage, lease and dispose of the same.

To purchase, hire, construct or manufacture, for use in connection with the business of the Company, any and all kinds of chattels and personal property suitable to or for the business of the Company.

To purchase, acquire, hold, use, sell, transfer, mortgage, pledge and dispose of all kinds of personal property and merchandize.

To borrow money for the needs of the Company, and to mortgage, pledge or hypothecate any or all assets of the Company, real or personal, in security for loans made to the Company.

To establish and maintain booms, piers, wharves and such other conveniences as are suitable to the protection or shipment of logs, lumber or other commodities dealt in by the Company, providing the same do not obstruct navigation of any stream or river.

To operate any of the works of the Company by water, steam, electricity, compressed air, or any other motive power, and generally to equip, maintain and use plants in connection with their business producing steam, electricity or compressed air, and by means thereof to supply heat, light or power to other persons or corporations.

3. The office or principal place of business of the Company is to be at Gibson, in the Parish of Saint Mary's, in the County of York.

4.
