

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a Charter of incorporation, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and amending Acts thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is THE MARITIME PUBLISHING CO., Limited.

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase, buy or otherwise acquire, take over and hold in whole or in part, the business at present carried on by James D. McKenna, in the Town of Sussex, in the County of King's and Province of New Brunswick, consisting of the printing and publishing of THE KING'S COUNTY RECORD and of a general job printing business, with the rights, good-will and franchises of said King's County Record (together with the subscription lists and the name of the same) and of all said job printing business, together with all machinery, stock and equipment of said business carried on by said James D. McKenna, and to continue, carry on and conduct the printing and publishing of said King's County Record and said job printing business, with all rights, privileges and appurtenances in connection therewith, and generally to do all things necessary therefor or incident thereto.

(b) To print, publish, circulate, sell and otherwise deal in daily, tri-weekly, semi-weekly, weekly, monthly and semi-monthly newspapers, agricultural papers and magazines, and books, pamphlets, legal and commercial forms and other papers and publications, and to conduct and carry on job printing, book binding, paper ruling, stereotyping, engraving, lithographing, and generally the commencing and carrying on the business of newspaper proprietors, general printers and publishers, and advertising agents, and the buying, selling, importing, dealing at wholesale and by retail in books, papers, stationery and printers' supplies and advertising novelties.

(c) To purchase, or otherwise acquire, all or any part of the business, property, rights, franchises and liabilities of any company, society, partnership or persons formed or engaged in any of the above or any similar objects or purposes, and the conducting, amalgamating with, liquidating or winding-up any such business, and the establishing, promoting, becoming stockholder, shareholder or partner in, or otherwise assisting or becoming interested in or connected with any company, society, partnership or undertaking in said Province or elsewhere, the objects or purposes of which shall in whole or in part be the same as or similar to any object or purpose of this Company.

(d) To build, erect, purchase, hire or otherwise acquire all buildings, offices, workshops, machinery, lands, tenements, hereditaments and other things which such Company may desire or deem necessary, useful or expedient for or in connection with such objects or purposes or any of them, and the selling, leasing, mortgaging, hypothecating or otherwise disposing of all or any of the real and personal property, rights and franchises of the Company.

(e) To purchase or otherwise acquire any patent rights or inventions, copyrights or secret processes which may be useful for any of said objects and purposes, and to grant licenses to use the same, and to establish and conduct agencies and branch offices in said Province or elsewhere, and to discontinue and regulate the same, and the doing, causing and procuring any and all such acts, matters and things as shall or may be incidental or conducive to the said objects and purposes or any of them, and generally to do all things necessary or expedient for carrying out the objects of said Company hereinafter mentioned or any of them, or anything incidental thereto, subject, however, to the laws of the Province of New Brunswick.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be in the Town of Sussex, in the County of King's and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the Company is to be Twenty-four thousand dollars, divided into two hundred and forty shares of One hundred dollars each.

LORD MEATH CHALLENGE CUPS AND LEAGUE OF THE EMPIRE PRIZES.

The Chief Superintendent of Education directs the attention of Teachers and Pupils in the Primary and Secondary schools to the Lord Meath Challenge Cups and League of the Empire prizes offered for competition to all the schools of the Empire:

The following are the conditions and subjects:—

(A.) LORD MEATH EMPIRE DAY PRIZE (Secondary Schools).—A Silver Challenge Cup, value £10 10s., presented by the Right Hon. the Earl of Meath, K. P., to be held by the School, and a personal prize of £5 5s., given by the League of the Empire, is offered for competition, inter all Secondary Schools of the Empire, for an Empire Day Essay of not more than 2,000 words.

Subject: "The Ideas expressed by the word 'Empire.'"

(B.) LORD MEATH EMPIRE DAY PRIZE (Primary Schools).—A Silver Challenge Cup, value £10 10s., presented by the Right Hon. the Earl of Meath, K. P., and a personal prize of £3 3s., given by the League of the Empire, is offered for competition, inter all Primary Schools of the Empire, for an Empire Day Essay of not more than 1,000 words.

Subject: "The Chief Stages in the Growth of Greater Britain."

All Essays must first be judged in the Schools, and afterwards through Representatives of the League in the different countries of the Empire.

Only those Essays sent in through the authorised channels will be eligible for the final judging arranged for by the Federal Council of the League in London. These Essays must be sent to the Education Office not later than the 10th day of January, 1906, in order to reach the Central Office in London by the 1st of February next.
