

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act," Chapter 85 of The Consolidated Statutes, 1903, and amending Acts thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE A. L. WRIGHT LUMBER Co., (Limited)."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought, are:-

(a) To buy, acquire, obtain, in whole or in part, the good-will, stock in trade, merchandise, choses in action and property, including mills, grist-mills, plant, machinery and equipment, wharves, piers, boom privileges, stock of general merchandise, lumber and wood goods, lumber land, lumber licenses and privileges, water rights and privileges, and all or part of the real estate and personal property and assets of the business of the Alexander Wright & Co., doing business at Coverdale, in the County of Albert, and also of any other person or persons, body corporate or bodies corporate, and the business being carried on therewith or thereby, and to conduct and carry on the same, and with power to sell, mortgage, encumber, let or otherwise dispose of the property aforesaid as and when the Company may deem it desirable so to do.

(b) To carry on a general lumber business in all its branches, including the logging, driving, sawing, manufacturing and shipping of lumber of any kind and description, whether manufactured or unmanufactured, and the buying, selling and dealing in lumber of every kind, both manufactured and unmanufactured, both wholesale and retail; to erect and maintain saw-mills, and to operate the same for the manufacture of lumber.

(c) To carry on the business of store-keeping and general trading, and dealers in merchandise of all kinds, whether wholesale or retail.

(d) To carry on the business of farming, and to cultivate, raise, produce, buy, sell and deal in all kinds of agricultural products, and to build, buy, own and operate cheese and butter factories, and also to erect, equip, buy, operate and carry on flour, feed and grist mill or mills by roller or other process, and to purchase and sell grains and cereals of every kind, and to manufacture, buy and sell flour and other food articles manufactured from grain or cereals.

(e) To generate, buy, use, sell, accumulate, store, transmit, furnish and distribute electric current for light, heat and power, and for other purposes, and to manufacture, buy, sell, operate, lease and let electric light fixtures, supplies and appurtenances used in connection therewith, and to use, develop, manufacture or produce steam, water, electricity or any other power, force or energy capable of being developed into mechanical power as of motive power or otherwise, and to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy, sell and deal in the same, and all other property, franchises, rights and privileges in connection with the same.

(f) To construct and maintain telephone lines for distribution of electric current and for the transmission of messages, and also to lease or sell the said lines, and to construct and maintain the same when convenient or desirable for the business of the Company, and for that purpose, subject to the Municipal regulations as to the construction and maintenance thereof, to have the right to place, construct, erect and maintain upon and along the highways all necessary poles and lines of wire.

(g) To quarry and to take out stone, and to dress, deal in, buy and sell the same, and to do all work in connection with the manufacture of stone.

(h) To establish, operate and conduct machine shops and factories, and the manufacturing and repairing of all kinds of machinery, and to carry on a general blacksmithing, horse-shoeing and farrier business.

(i) To manufacture any of the articles capable of being manufactured, which the Company is authorized to buy, sell, use or deal in, and to build, equip, acquire, operate and manage such buildings, mills, factories, machinery and tramways as the Company may deem necessary for the purpose of its business; and to buy, sell, lease, manufacture, let, mortgage, pledge, and generally without limitation by reason of the foregoing particulars to acquire, hold, manage, alienate, mortgage and otherwise encumber as and when the Company deem it desirable so to do, any and all kinds of property, as well real as personal, which the Company in the course of their business may deem it to their advantage to deal with.

(j) To do any and all things above set forth as objects, purposes or otherwise, and any and all things necessary, suitable, convenient, desirable or proper for the accomplishment of the purposes or the attainment of one or more of the objects hereinbefore enumerated or incidental to the powers hereinbefore named which shall or may at any time appear conducive or expedient to such accomplishment or attainment or for the protection of the Company, either as holders of or interested in any property or otherwise, to the same extent as fully as natural persons might or could do.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be at Salisbury, in the County of Westmorland, and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The capital stock of the Company is to be Seventy-five thousand dollars, divided into Seven hundred and fifty shares of One hundred dollars each.
