

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893, and amendments thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body politic and corporate under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE CAMPOBELLO ISLAND TELEPHONE COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—

(b) To make connection with the cable or submarine wire of any company, corporation, individual or the Canadian Government, now laid or constructed, or which may hereafter be laid or constructed, and with whom the said Company may hereafter be able to enter into satisfactory terms or arrangements for the purpose of establishing, securing and maintaining telephonic communication between the before mentioned points in the said Parish of Campobello and the Parish of West Isles, in the County of Charlotte, or the mainland, or any point or points not located or being in the said Parish of Campobello, such cable or submarine connection to be made at or from such point on the said Island or Parish of Campobello as the said Company shall deem most suitable, convenient and expeditious for its purposes and as the said Company may hereafter determine upon.

(c) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, own and hold such lands, licenses, privileges, buildings, plant and other real and personal property as may be required for the above purposes.

(d) To erect and maintain the necessary posts, poles, wires and other works along the public streets and highways between the above named places or in the territory above specified, and for that purpose to have full power and authority given to the said Company, their successors or assigns, their agents, servants and workmen to enter upon the side or sides of all or any of the public roads, bridges, streets or highways within the said Parish of Campobello, and upon the same to set up, erect and construct such and so many posts, poles or other works as the said Company in its discretion may deem necessary for making, completing, supporting, using, working and maintaining a system of communication by telephone between the said places or within the said territory. To stretch wires thereon and from time to time, as often as it may be necessary, to break open any part whatsoever of the said roads, streets or highways, not, however, to interfere with that part of the same appropriated for the use of carriages, waggons, or horses, and to keep the same open during the time necessary for the setting up, erecting, constructing, maintaining and repairing or replacing of such posts, poles or other works used in connection with the works of the said Company.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be at Wilson's Beach, Parish of Campobello, in the County of Charlotte.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the Company is to be Two thousand dollars, divided into two thousand shares of One dollar each.
