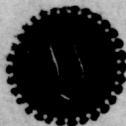

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province bearing date the first day of June, A. D. 1905, incorporating George E. Ford, of the Town of Sackville, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Hilton A. Ford, of the same place, Clerk; Fred L. To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over the general mercantile business now carried on by George E.
