

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of a Charter of incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "FRED B. EDGECOMBE COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase and acquire the general dry goods business heretofore carried on by Frederick B. Edgcombe in the City of Fredericton, in the Province of New Brunswick, and stock in trade, personal property, choses in action, rights and effects belonging to the said Frederick B. Edgcombe, and the good-will of the said business, and certain real and leasehold property in connection therewith.

(b) To continue and carry on the general dry goods business, by wholesale and retail, heretofore owned by the said Frederick B. Edgcombe, and to enlarge same so as to include a general departmental mercantile business in all its branches, with full powers to establish and maintain such business and to do and perform all things in connection therewith and incidental thereto, and also to establish, conduct and maintain branches and warehouses in any part of New Brunswick, or elsewhere, whenever deemed necessary or expedient in connection with said business, or any part thereof, and do and perform any and all other acts, deeds or things incidental to or necessary for the purposes of the Company.

(c) To generate and manufacture electric light, heat and power upon the premises of the Company for the use of the Company, and to supply, sell and dispose of same to others, and make and enter into all contracts necessary in connection therewith.

(d) To purchase and acquire any stock in trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses, leases, effects or assets of any person or persons or incorporated Company now or hereafter carrying on business, or take security thereon, or to continue same when so acquired, and to sell and dispose of same when so acquired and every part thereof.

(e) To purchase, have and hold real and personal property of all kinds, including leaseholds, and to mortgage, sell or otherwise dispose of same or any part thereof as may become necessary for the purposes of or incidental to the business of the said Company.

(f) To enter into any contract, or contracts, agreement or agreements, union of interest, co operation, with any person, firm or Company carrying on or about to carry on any business or transaction deemed capable of being conducted for the benefit of the Company.

(g) To sell, convey, alienate, lease, let, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or deal with all and every part of the property both real and personal of the said Company, upon any terms whatever, subject to the provisions of said Act or Acts in amendment thereto, together with all such other powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the proposed Company in all its branches, with such other things as are incidental thereto.

3. The office or principal place of business of the Company is to be at the City of Fredericton in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The nominal capital of the Company is to be Sixty-five thousand dollars, to be divided in six hundred and fifty shares of One hundred dollars each.
