NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereinafter become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purpose hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the company is "SHEASGREEN DRUG COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "J. & T. JARDINE, (Limited)."
