NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of a Charter of incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "ELECTRICAL SUPPLY COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To acquire and exploit, manufacture and sell, and generally to deal in certain new and useful improvements in Adjustable Suspenders for Electrical Devices, invented and patented by Austin Berry, Manufacturer, of Ottawa, in the Province of Ontario, under No. 93832, issued by the Dominion of Canada, dated June 20th, 1905, and all improvements and additions thereto.

(b) To farm out the manufacture and use of said new and useful improvements in Adjustable Suspenders for Electrical devices, appliances and devices, and Patent rights upon Royalty or otherwise.

(c) To pay and settle for the said Patent right and other Patent

rights by issue of paid up stock of the proposed Company, in whole or in part, as may be determined upon by the Board of Directors.

(d) To acquire any invention, addition or improvement in Electrical devices, appliances, devices and Electrical Suspenders for Electrical devices, and to apply for and obtain Patents therefor in the name of the Company.

(e) To purchase or acquire any exclusive right, patent rights or privileges in connection with the business of the Company, and any license to use and work the same, and to sell or lease any patent or patents acquired by the Company, or any right of selling, using or manufacturing thereunder respectively.

(f) To purchase or otherwise acquire from any person, partnership or company all or any business within the objects of this Company, and any lands, property, privileges, rights, contracts and liabilities appertaining to the same, and in connection with any such purchase to undertake the liabilities of any person, partnership, association and company, and generally to carry on the business of the Company within the Province of New Brunswick, and elsewhere in the Dominion of Canada.

(g) To acquire by purchase or otherwise stock in any companies doing a similar business.

(h) To acquire by purchase, lease or exchange, hire or otherwise, lands or any interest therein, to erect and construct buildings on land of the Company, and to rebuild and improve said buildings.

(i) To enter into, make and execute contracts relating to the objects for which the Company is incorporated with any person, firm, association or other corporation.

(j) To sell and dispose of the whole or any part of the property, undertaking, patent, patent rights and franchises of the proposed Company to any other Company or person.

(k) To construct, purchase and maintain any plant, buildings, works, factories, mills and other undertakings for the purposes of the Company in connection therewith, or necessary or expedient for any of the purposes of the Company or incidental thereto.

(l) To purchase, acquire, hold, use, sell, transfer and dispose of personal property of all kinds, machinery, patents, trade-mark etc., lease, mortgage, sell, transfer and dispose of and otherwise deal, with all or any of the property, real, personal, powers, privileges, patent, patent rights and franchises of the Company, and to accept, as a consideration therefor cash or any shares, stock debentures or securities of any other company, and generally to do all things necessary or expedient for carrying out the objects of the said Company.

3. The principal place of business of the Company is to be in the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The Capital Stock of the Company is to be Thirty thousand dollars, (\$30,000.00), divided into thirty thousand shares of One dollar each.
