

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter mentioned will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick in Council for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation, by Letters Patent, under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and Acts in amendment thereof.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is to be "F. W. DANIEL & COMPANY Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

For the purpose of purchasing, acquiring and taking over, as a going concern, the business and undertaking at present carried on by Frederick W.
