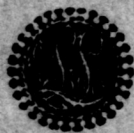

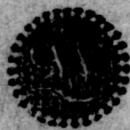
### PROCLAMATION.

### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,** That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the sixteenth day of April, A. D. 1907, incorporating Henry C.
