

### IN THE MATTER OF THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of a Charter of incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter stated:

1. The name of the proposed Company is to be "THE UNITED PAINT COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

To make, manufacture, mix, amalgamate, reduce, mine, mills put up, buy, sell, exchange, and deal in paints, leads, clays, pigments, oils, whittings, colorings, fillings, stains, varnishes and every other substance or material of a like or similar nature, used in or suitable for preserving or decorating woods and other substances whatsoever, and to do all other matters and things incidental to the above objects.

To make, manufacture, buy, sell, and trade in tin cans, cases, boxes, barrels, kegs, and other receptacles made of tin, iron, wood, or any other material or materials combined, and for the purposes aforesaid to purchase and deal in tins, irons, wood and every material necessary, whether manufactured or unmanufactured and to manufacture the same as required.

To carry on the business of printers, lithographers, stereotypers, electrotypers, engravers, and to do printing in all its branches and all things incidental thereto.

To print labels, advertisements and to print, publish, conduct and circulate or otherwise deal in newspapers or other publications and do job printing in all its branches.

To enter into contracts for the building, painting, repairing and decorating of buildings of every description, and of bridges and structures of every kind. And for all the purposes aforesaid to purchase, lease, acquire, have, hold, sell, dispose of, pledge, hypothecate, and deal in paint, mines and clays and real and personal property of every description.

To have, hold, use and enjoy, purchase, acquire or dispose of Letters Patent of Invention and copyrights, patent rights and privileges, and to work, use, develop, and exercise the same and any in which the company may become interested whether as owner, licensee or otherwise and to pay therefor in shares of said company or otherwise.

To acquire by original subscription or otherwise and to purchase, hold, sell, transfer or otherwise dispose of or hypothecate the shares, stock, bonds, debentures or other obligations of any other company authorized to carry on business or undertaking within their powers, and to pay therefor in shares of the said company or otherwise.

3. The office or principal place of business of the Company is to be at Dorchester, in the County of Westmorland, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the proposed Company is One hundred thousand dollars, to be divided into ten hundred shares of a par value of One hundred dollars each.
