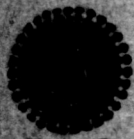

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-second day of April, A. D. 1907, incorporating Simeon H. White, Merchant; James A. Murray, Manufacturer's Agent; Samuel A. McLeod, Insurance Agent; Rutherford Murray, Medical Doctor; Duncan H. McAlister, Medical Doctor; Edward Connely, Merchant; and Herbert A. McArthur, Commercial Traveller; all of the Town of Sussex, in the County of King's and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:—

To establish and conduct a social and literary association. To acquire by hire, leasehold or purchase, and to take, have, hold and own for a term or terms, or in fee simple, such personal property and real estate as may be necessary and desirable for the purposes of the said Association, with full power, subject to the provisions of the said Act, to mortgage, hypothecate, sell, dispose and convey the same, and to execute all necessary instruments of transfer or conveyance.

To construct, erect and equip, and to enter into contracts or agreements for the construction, erection and equipment of necessary buildings for the use of the said Association.

To establish, conduct and manage in connection with the said Association, a social club, with restaurants, reading rooms, games, contests, musical and literary entertainments, and theatricals and shows, and with full power for such purposes to establish, appoint, engage, employ and contract with necessary troupes, companies, committees, managers, employees, assistants and servants, to contract for and purchase all goods and merchandise, furniture, fittings and supplies necessary for the purposes herein mentioned, and, subject to the provisions of the said Act, to make, sign, endorse, take, hold and negotiate all necessary bills, notes, drafts, cheques or negotiable instruments.

To make provision that the shares of the Capital Stock of said Association shall not be transferable to any person not then being a member or shareholder in said Association, until the name of the proposed transferee has first been submitted for the approval of the existing shareholders or members, and affirmed in such manner as by the By-Laws of the Association may be prescribed.

To provide for the appointing of Trustees who shall receive and hold the net proceeds arising from all sources except from Capital Stock of the Association, with power vested in such Trustees to invest such net proceeds in the said Capital Stock, and to require all stockholders upon demand to transfer their shares of stock to said Trustees upon refunding to the holders thereof all payments made by them on account of such stock, with interest at six per cent. less any dividend paid on the said shares.

To do all such other things as are incidental to and necessary for the carrying out of the above objects; by the name of "Sussex Institute, Limited," with a total Capital Stock of Twenty-four thousand dollars, divided into twenty-four hundred shares of Ten dollars each.
