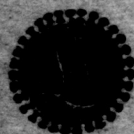

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named, will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is the "GREEN RIVER ELECTRIC COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, develop, operate, maintain, manage and control for the purposes of the Company and general commercial purposes, any water power or water powers, and in connection therewith to excavate, dig, make or construct any and all canals, trenches, dams, abutments, piers, wharves, booms and other works proper, necessary or desirable for the proper development of any such water power or water powers.

(b) To carry on the business of electricians, manufacturers, workers and dealers in electricity for motive power, heat and light, and to buy, sell and deal in all articles belonging to such business, and to light streets, places and buildings of every nature and kind, public and private, in the County of Madawaska and adjoining Counties and outside the Province, by means of electricity; to construct, maintain and operate works for the supply and distribution of electricity for

light, heat and power, and generally for all other purposes, to manufacture, generate, use, buy, sell, accumulate, store, transmit, furnish and distribute electric current for light, heat and power.

(c) To enter from time to time, subject to such conditions as the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may prescribe, upon any public streets, roads, squares plots of ground and highways in the County of Madawaska and adjoining Counties in the Province, and to break up and open public roads, streets, plots of ground and highways or any part thereof for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and posts and stringing and maintaining wires for electric light, heat and power purposes and for renewing and repairing the same, and for placing and maintaining under ground along and across such public streets, roads, squares, plots of ground and highways, street mains, pipes or conduits for the conveying of electricity for light, heat and power purposes and for renewing and repairing the same.

(d) To build, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and operate mills and factories of all kinds, including mills for the manufacture of logs and wood in all its branches and grain of all kinds, and generally to carry on any and all kinds of business in connection therewith, including or in relation thereto or a part thereof logging, driving, booming and sawing of logs, lumber and wood, and manufacturing, buying, selling, trading and dealing in logs, lumber and wood and grain, manufactured and unmanufactured, and all products and by-products thereof, and all products and by-products derived from any operation of the plant of the company.

(e) To carry on a general store and supply business, and in connection therewith to buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of goods, wares and merchandise.

(f) To acquire by original subscription or purchase, or otherwise, and to hold, sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of shares and stock, whether common or preferred, or any bonds, debentures, stock, or other interest in or other obligation of any Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company, with full power to authorize an agent to vote in respect to any such stock so acquired.

(g) To purchase, lease, acquire, own, hold, develop, operate, maintain, manage and control all kinds of real and personal estate, including timber limits, grants, licenses, permits, lumber privileges, water privileges, shore rights, dams, works, buildings, machinery, plant, patents of invention and rights therein, easements of all kinds, the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person, or company carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company, with power to amalgamate with any such Company, and with power also to sell, mortgage, lease, license, hire or otherwise dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part or parts thereof, or any of the real or personal property, franchises, rights, or credits of the Company, for such consideration and to such persons, firms or corporations as this Company sees fit.

(h) To do any and all things above set forth as objects, purposes, powers or otherwise, and any and all things necessary, suitable, convenient, desirable or proper, or which may be deemed by the Company necessary, suitable, convenient, desirable or proper for the accomplishment of the purposes or the attainment of the objects or the exercise of the powers hereinbefore enumerated, or any of them, or of any purpose, object or power incidental to any of the same, or desirable for the benefit or protection of the Company, either as the holders of or interested in any property or otherwise, and as well without as within the said Province of New Brunswick, to the same extent and as fully to all intents and purposes as natural persons might or could do.

(i) The Board of Directors may issue the shares of the common stock of the Company as fully paid up and non-assessable to the promoters of the Company, in payment for organization and other expenses, and for services of the directors, and other persons, performed for the Company, and the same, when so issued, shall be declared to be and shall be fully paid up and non-assessable.

3. The chief place of business of the Company is to be at the Town of Edmundston, in the County of Madawaska and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock is to be Forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into nine hundred and eighty shares of Fifty dollars each.
