NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of August, A. D. 1907, incorporating Henry Chestnut, of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; William T. Chestnut, of the same place, Merchant; Harry G. Chestnut, of the same place, Merchant; Willard Kitchen, of the Parish of Kingsclear, in the said County, Railway Contractor; and Ned H. Murchie, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, Province aforesaid, Lumberman; for the following purposes, namely:—

To establish, carry on, operate and conduct a general business for the manufacture and sale of canvas canoes and boats and other articles made of canvas and wood, or either, or of any other material other than canvas or wood, whether metal or otherwise, and for the manufacture of machinery, engines, boilers, and any and all electrical or other mechanical appliances, including generators and motor outfits and appliances, as well as any and all kinds of fittings, whether wood or metal, or a combination of wood with any other substance, all as may be necessary in connection with or incidental to the manufacture of such canoes, boats or other articles, or as may be necessary or in any way incidental to any of the purposes of the said Company.

For the purposes aforesaid, to have, hold, use and enjoy, purchase, acquire or dispose of Letters Patent of Invention, patent rights and privileges, and to work, use, develop and exercise same, and any in which the Company may become interested, whether as owner, licensee or otherwise.

To purchase, lease, exchange, hire or acquire any real or personal property and privileges for the purposes herein set forth, with full power and liberty at any and all times, subject to the provisions of the said Act, to sell, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of the operations of undertakings of the Company, or any part thereof, or any or all of such property and privileges, franchises, assets, rights or credits; and to enter into contracts for the erection, fitting up and building or repairing of a factory or factories, buildings and erections of all kinds, as well as water craft of every kind and description.

To carry on the business of buying, selling, trading, bartering and giving of all kinds of goods, wares, and merchandise, including logs or lumber of every description, both wholesale and retail, and for that purpose to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy, lands, timber limits, buildings, stores, factories, warehouses and plant considered necessary, desirable or expedient by the Company.

Subject to the provisions of the said Act, to acquire by purchase, subscription, or otherwise, and to hold, sell, purchase or otherwise dispose of shares and stock, either common or preferred, or bonds,

debentures or other interest in any company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company, and to acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or company carrying on business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possess all property suitable for the purposes of this Company; to pay for such property, rights, franchises or things as are above set out in shares of the Company, or otherwise, with full power to lease, sub-let, sell, dispose of or otherwise deal with any or all of the property and rights of the Company; by the name of "CHESTNUT CANOE COMPANY, Limited," with a total Capital Stock of Forty-eight thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and eighty shares of One hundred dollars each.
