FORESTRY CONVENTION, FREDERICTON,

Wednesday 20th and Thursday 21st February, A. D. 1907.

BY VIRTUE of the provisions of an Act passed by the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at its last Session, intituled "An Act for the better protecting and preserving the Public Domain," the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council was authorized to summon a Forestry Convention during the present year, to be held in the City of Fredericton, at which all persons interested in the protection of the forests or science of forestry should be publicly invited to attend; notice is hereby given, that an Order-in-Council has been passed for the calling of such Convention at the City of Fredericton on Wednesday the 20th and Thursday the 21st days of February now next; and that all persons interested in the protection of the forests of New Brunswick, or science of forestry, are hereby invited to attend such Convention. The following subjects, among others, will be discussed:—

- 1st. The general need of Forest Preservation.
- 2nd. Attitude of Educational Institutions towards forestry.
- 3rd. Dependence of business interests on forests.
- 4th. The lumbermen's interest in preservation of forests.
- 5th. The development of water power as related to forests.
- 6th. The forest Policy of the United States and other Countries.
- 7th. Addresses upon the subjects relating to forestry protection embodied in the Public Domain Act.

Special rates for transportation of those attending the Convention will be arranged with the I. C. and C. P. Railways.

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the twenty eighth day of January, A. D., 1907; incorporating George S. Stothart, of the Town of Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Gilmour G. Stothart, of the same place, Merchant; D. William Stothart, of the same place, Merchant; Charles P. Stothart, of the same place, Clerk; and Gertrude J. Stothart, of the same place, Single Woman, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over the milling and planing and woodworking business now carried on at Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick, by George S. Stothart, of Newcastle aforesaid, Manufacturer; the general mercantile and trading business now carried on in Newcastle aforesaid by the said George S. Stothart and Gilmour G. Stothart, of Newcastle aforesaid, Merchant; and the coal business carried on in Newcastle aforesaid by the said George S. Stothart, Gilmour G. Stothart and D. William Stothart, of Newcastle aforesaid, Merchant, with power to acquire all or any of the properties, stock-in-trade, chattels, merchandise, good-will, assets and effects of the said business, and to carry on and continue the same or any portion thereof.

To carry on and operate a general sawmill business, in all its branches, including the procuring, sawing and manufacturing of lumber of every description and kind, and the buying, selling and dealing in lumber of every kind, manufactured and unmanufactured, both wholesale and retail, and to acquire, erect and maintain mills for the sawing and manufacturing of lumber of all kinds and to carry on a general building and contracting business.

To purchase, deal in and sell, by wholesale and retail, all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise necessary for or usual in the carrying on a general mercantile business.

For the purposes of its business to build, lease, charter, acquire and hold real estate, vessels and other personal property of all kinds, with power to sell and dispose of the same, and likewise, subject to the provisions of the said Act, to mortgage the same from time to time.

To do such other things as may be necessary or incidental to the said business or any part thereof.

The said Company shall be liable for the debts and obligations of the said George S. Stothart and Gilmour G. Stothart, and also for the said George S. Stothart, Gilmour G. Stothart and D. William Stothart respectively, existing at the time of the taking over of the said respective businesses, and may be sued for the same in any Court of competent jurisdiction; by the name of "THE STOTHART MERCANTILE COMPANY, Limited;" with a total capital stock of Forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and ninety shares of One hundred dollars each.
