Now Know Ye that We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, proclaim and declare that Monday, the twenty-fifth day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eight, is hereby fixed as the day for the celebration of said Birthday. Nevertheless it is Our pleasure that the usual salute in honour of Our said Birthday shall be fired at all Military Stations on the said ninth day of November next.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

In TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-Beloved Cousin the Right Honourable SIR ALBERT HENRY GEORGE EARL GREY, Viscount Howick, Baron Grey of Howick, in the County of Northumberland in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, and a Baronet; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, etc., etc., Governor General and Commander in Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, at Our City of OTTAWA, this FOURTEENTH day of OCTOBER, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seven, and in the seventh year of Our Reign.
