To promote the health and recreation of its memb To promote the health and recreation of its members by the pursuit of fishing and hunting; to acquire and hold the right, to be exercised by the members, to fish in such lakes and rivers as may be granted by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council; to acquire by purchase or lease from time to time, and to hold, with approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, such real estate and fishing rights as the wants of the Club may require; to lease and sell the real estate belonging to the Club, and to sub let any right the Company may have to fish in any rivers, streams or lakes, or to grant permission to such persons as it may see fit to fish in such rivers, streams or lakes, or to shoot game on its lands, subject to the laws of the Province, and the regulations of the Department of Crown Lands applicable to or governing the same; to take such actions or proceedings as may be necessary to protect the fish in actions or proceedings as may be necessary to protect the fish in the rivers, streams or lakes upon, in or over which it may acquire rights and the game on its lands; to build upon the lands held by the Club all houses and other buildings required from time to time for the accommodation of its members, agents, officers and servants of the Club; by the name of "Big Hole Salmon Finning Club, Limited;" with a total Capital Stock of Five thousand dollars, divided into fifty shares of One hundred dollars each.
